"The land is the simplest form of architecture," Wright wrote in 1937. "Building upon the land is as natural to man as to other animals, birds, or insects." Wright believed architecture is formed by the human spirit, and that a mere building does not know this spirit. As Wright stated: "We must perceive architecture, if we are to understand it at all, to be a spirit of the spirit of man that will live as long as man lives."
